1. Expand Your Target Employer List

MBA graduates often spend hours upon hours sorting through job listings, compiling information about businesses, and desperately trying to develop new contacts, all in the effort of landing a big interview for their dream job.

All of this might seem like necessary steps of your job search but honestly, it's simply an inefficient use of your time.

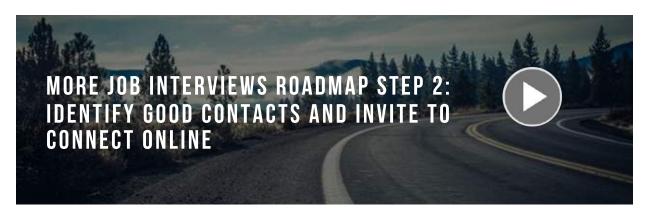
Most MBA grads compile far too much information while looking for their dream job, much of which you simply don't need.

What you do need is to develop an effective and efficient job search methodology, allowing you to quickly develop a target list of employers, prioritized by your desire to be hired, the availability of positions, and any contacts or alumni that work there.

Steve Dalton, the author of *The 2-Hour Job Search* and the Senior Associate Director of the Career Management Center and Duke University's Fuqua School of Business, has developed a four-step method to keep job searchers focused on the prize, rather than dig through mountains of irrelevant data.

He calls this the L.A.M.P. method: List, Alumni, Motivation, and Postings. When properly applied, the L.A.M.P. method should help you to create a specifically prioritized target list of potential employers in just 70 minutes.

2. Identify Good Contacts and Invite to Connect Online

LinkedIn is going to become your best friend, whether you like it or not. It's by far the most effective method of identifying and connecting to great professional connections online. The problem is that without effective search strategies, you're going to be awash in an overwhelming sea of potential contacts.

After setting up an amazing online profile, your first step to look for new contacts is to hit the search button (the little magnifying glass). First search for new contacts with the People, Jobs or Companies filter. Later you can search on Schools or Groups.

3. Request Informational Meeting with New Contacts





"So you've invited people to connect, they've started to accept, what do you do with these new connections?" - Viveka von Rosen

Now that you've found some new connections on LinkedIn and they've accepted your requests, it's time to contact them! What do you say? on how soon you contact with them after they've accepted your invitation. You can begin by writing:

"Thanks so much for accepting my invitation to connect. I really appreciate it. As a reminder, I'm the recent Graduate who recently reached out to you on (date). I have a few questions about (Company or Industry). Could I send my questions to you in an email or here on LinkedIn? Or if you have 10 minutes, can I get on a call with you?"

If you are fortunate to get an informational interview with your new connection, it's very important that you send a follow-up message the next day thanking them for their time and effort. It could read something like:

"Thank you so much for your time yesterday. These are the actions I have taken _____. Your guidance means so much!"

Always be sure that your messages end with your name, phone number, email address, and a link to your website or calendar app.

The point of all this is to score an informational or networking interview. How can you be sure that this interview will go well and you will make a new, important contact that could contribute to your future success? Read on!

4. Conduct Professional Networking Meetings

Networking Meetings: A Five-Step Structure

A great networking meeting has five different stages from the first greeting until the final handshake.

Phase 1: The Great First Impression Set the agenda so your contact will know exactly what to expect. Prepare to take charge of the meeting!

Phase 2: The Great Overview
Give your contact a 60-second snapshot of your education and career so far.

Phase 3: The Great Discussion

This is going to be the biggest part of your networking meeting. Break the discussion down into five key questions.

Phase 4: The Great Ending

Review any planned actions that you and your contact agreed on earlier in the meeting. If they offered to set you up with a contact, be sure to mention that at the end to solidify that plan.

Phase 5: The Great Follow-Up

Follow-up with the person you had the meeting with, and follow-up with the person who referred you to them. By contacting both people, you will be strengthening up your networking circle, always a good thing.

5. Keep In Touch With Contacts

Dux-Soup is a free Chrome extension that integrates with LinkedIn, allowing you to tag profiles and take notes directly within their profile without having to pay for LinkedIn's paid services. There are both desktop and mobile versions, both of which are free to use (although they do have premium versions available).

Once installed in Chrome, Dux-Soup will populate in LinkedIn. All you have to do is navigate to one of your connections. On the right-hand side of the screen, a new pop-up box will appear where you can tag people and take notes. These notes and tags are just for you, no one can see that you've tagged them. It's simply a way of sorting and managing your existing network.

Once you've finished tagging, you will see a "tags saved" pop-up. Now, if you want to quickly find a connection, you can enter into the Chrome Extension and scroll down to "Search by Tag". Put in your search criteria, and connections tagged with that keyword will instantly appear. When you click on their name, you will be taken to their full profile on LinkedIn. It's that easy!

Using Dux-Soup, you will be able to keep all of your new connections straight and organized, making keeping in touch with them all a snap!
